

Getting a California Driver's License

Obtaining a driver's license can be a complicated process. Follow these easy steps to make this tedious process less "painful"!

Things to remember before applying for a California Driver's License:

- ➤ Wait <u>at least 10 days</u> after your status has been changed from "Initial" or "Transfer Pending" to "Continued Attendance"
 - (This is to ensure that your immigration status and documents are updated and processed)
- Gather required immigration documents & paperwork beforehand
- *You have three chances to pass the driving test. If you fail, you can make another appointment. There is no waiting period, but you will be subject to pay a fee for each additional driving test afterwards.

Documents to bring:

- ✓ I-20 Form in "Continued Attendance" status
- ✓ I-94 Arrival/Departure Record

 You will either have it on your passport or you can access the electronic record:
- www.cbp.gov/i94 and print out a copy

 ✓ Valid passport (with your visa, if applicable)
- ✓ Social Security Number or proof of birth/legal presence documents
- ✓ Proof of residence (US Bank account statement mailed to your home address)
- ✓ Utility Bill (ex. Electric or phone bill with your name on it)
- ✓ Enrollment Verification Letter (from the university)

<u>To apply:</u>

- 1) Make an appointment before visiting the DMV office https://dmv.ca.gov/portal/dmv/detail/portal/foa/welcome
- 2) Complete an <u>original</u> application DL 44 form (available at the DMV)
- 3) Pay \$33 application fee
 - Note: All DMV offices accept payment by cash, check, money order, and ATM/Debit cards for payment of fees. Credit cards are not accepted.
- 4) Thumb print & picture will be taken
- 5) Pass a vision test and a traffic laws & signs test http://www.dmv.ca.gov/portal/dmv/?1dmy&urile=wcm:path:/dmv_content_en/dmv/pu bs/interactive/tdrive/exam
- 6) If you pass, make an appointment for a driving test
 - ✓ Call 1-800-777-0133 or online
 - ✓ Proof of insurance (financial responsibility)



Applying for a California State ID Card

Carrying around your passport can be very risky.

If you are not planning on driving, we recommend applying for a California State ID Card to carry around with you on a daily basis.

You can apply for a California identification card at any age. A California State ID card is valid for six years.

To apply for an ID card you must visit a California Department of Motor Vehicles(DMV) office in person to:

- Complete a Driver License or Identification Card Application (Form DL 44). This form is not available online as it requires your original signature.
- Give your thumbprint.
- Have your picture taken.
- If you wish to complete the application form before your visit to the CA DMV, you can call the DMV's automated telephone system at (800) 777-0133 to have the form mailed to you.

Documents to bring:

- ✓ Social Security number. If you are ineligible for a SSN but are legally present in the U.S., you can still apply for a CA ID card.
- ✓ I-20 Form in "Continued Attendance" status
- ✓ I-94 Arrival/Departure Record
 - You will either have it on your passport or you can access the electronic record: www.cbp.gov/i94 and print out a copy
- ✓ Valid passport (with your visa, if applicable)
- ✓ Social Security Number or proof of birth/legal presence documents
- ✓ 2 documents proving your California residency, which could include:
 - o Utility Bill (ex. Electric or phone bill with your name on it)
 - o Title or deed to your residence/property.
 - o Pay stub from your employer.
- ✓ Enrollment Verification Letter (from the university)
